

Action Grants, are available to those looking to start or continue community-based discussions to create the local prevention of child abuse. Proposals for up to \$10,000 will be considered.


The second set of grantscalled Program Support Grants-are available to those planning, developing, expanding and enhancing new or existing primary and secondary prevention programs.
